- 7** Do not attempt to clean up a major spill. Contact the NPMCC and stand by in a safe location.
- 8** Once the chemical spill is under control, the staff should wait for the signal to return to the workplace. The signal is given by the safety officer.

WHAT TO DO DURING A CHEMICAL SPILL

WHILE IN UPM-PGH PREMISES



1 Cordon off the area to prevent access.

2 If possible, identify the substance by checking containers surrounding the spill.

3 Inform the supervisor of the incident. The supervisor will get in touch with the **National Poison Management & Control Center (NPMCC) 524-1078** or **554-8400** local **2311** or cellphone number **09228961541**.

4 Depending on the nature of the chemical, you might open the doors and windows to provide ventilation to the area.



5 Once the area is declared safe, assist any injured persons by removing them from exposure, getting them to a safe area and help them seek medical attention.

For chemical exposure to the skin:

- Immediately flush exposed area with water for at least 15 minutes.
- If no visible injuries are noted, remove all accessories.
- Soap the area.

For chemical exposure in the eyes:

- Irrigate the eyes at least 15 minutes with water.
- Remove contact lenses if possible.

For inhalational exposure:

- Transfer victim/s to an area with fresh air.
- Never attempt to enter an area where potentially dangerous contaminants might place you at risk.

If clothing catches fire:

- Use the **drop and roll** technique or flush with cold water to extinguish fire on clothes.
- Remove contaminated clothing and cover the victim.

6 For simple or minor spills, trained staff shall:

- Put on appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- Contain spill with absorbent spill material.
- Clean up residues by sweeping, double bagging, sealing, and labelling for proper disposal.
- Keep the area ventilated and decontaminated.
